### Using impersonal “se”

Similar to English “rules.” What are we not supposed to say in an essay? \_\_\_\_\_ So how do we rephrase? \_\_\_\_\_

It’s the same in Spanish! If we say “En México, comen la fruta” then we have to mean specific people...they. But we are talking “they” in general, meaning, the people. So we have to put “se” in front. It’s like saying “In México, one/they eat pineapple.” *Se comen la piña*. (See [SpanishDict.com](http://SpanishDict.com) for an explanation & practice)
